EXAMPLES OF RESEARCH PROJECTS IN PROGRESS

Evaluation of the Salud Para Todos Program in Michigan, Colorado, and North Carolina:

The Salud Para Todos Program utilizes promotoras—farmworkers trained to provide education and prevention activities—to educate farmworkers in the areas of mental health diagnoses, interventions, and coping. The project is assessing whether farmworkers who receive services (e.g., educational workshops, group support, individual assistance) from promotoras report reduced levels of migrant farmworker stress and depression and increased knowledge of risk factors for stress and depression.

Development of Coping Instrument for Acculturating Individuals:

Although research on acculturative stress has been steadily growing, there is a paucity of research that has examined coping in acculturating individuals. To better assess how individuals cope during the acculturative process, my research team and I developed a new coping tool, called the Coping Inventory, that measures the effectiveness of various coping styles used in reaction to acculturative and everyday stressors. We are currently piloting the measure.

Meta-Analysis of Acculturative Stress and Mental Health Indicators:

Although the literature on acculturative stress and mental health has grown over the past 20 years, to date no meta-analyses have been conducted on the impact of acculturative stress on the mental health of acculturating individuals.

In this meta-analysis, I am assessing the effect sizes of acculturative stress on anxiety, depression, substance use, and suicide behaviors in various ethnic groups.

Relationship of Cyberbullying through Social Media and Suicide Behavior:

Although case examples of cyberbullying and suicide are often reported in the media, research on the topic is scant. I am thus examining present and past cyberbullying as it relates to social media (e.g., Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, Tumblr, online gaming), text messaging and emails. I expect that consistently being a victim of cyberbullying will be linked to increased thwarted belongingness and an increased acquired capability for suicide, as severe cyberbullying may serve to desensitize individuals to pain and the fear of self-injury. These, in turn, may lead to an increase in suicide thoughts and behavior.

Physiological Examination of the Acquired Capability of Suicide:

Because most research on the acquired capability construct of the interpersonal theory has relied on self-report measures, my research team and I are using physiological measurements (through Biopac equipment) to assess the two components of the acquired capability of suicide. To assess emotional "desensitization to death," we are monitoring ECG data in reaction to death-related stimuli; and to examine "elevated pain tolerance" we are utilizing a cold pressor test. We are examining whether individuals with a history of repeated exposure to painful experiences will report elevated levels of desensitization and pain tolerance and whether these, in turn, will be related to greater suicide behaviors.

Rumination and Suicide Behavior:

Although rumination's role in depression is well-documented, research on rumination and suicide behavior is lacking. I am thus examining the influence of rumination on suicidal thoughts and behavior through depression, hopelessness, and a reduced ability to problem solve. I am also examining whether rumination interacts with burdensomeness to increase suicidality and whether it increases one's desensitization to painful stimuli.

Religious Social Support and Self-Efficacy as Mediators between Religiosity and Suicide Risk:

Although research has long found that religiosity is related to positive mental health, scant research has examined explanatory factors in this relationship. I am thus assessing religious social support and self-efficacy as possible mediators and I expect that these two factors will largely explain the connection between religion and mental health factors including anxiety, depression and suicide behaviors.

Quality of Sleep and Suicide Behavior:

This longitudinal research project is in collaboration with Grant Benham, Ph.D., UTRGV. We are using ActiGraph technology to assess the impact of sleep quality on suicide behavior. Risk and protective factors assessed include perceived stress, worry, perseverative cognitions and rumination, pre-sleep behavior and arousal, physical activity.

Marianismo and Suicide Behaviors in Latina Adolescents:

Data from the Youth Risk Behavior Surveillance System has indicated that Latina adolescents report greater suicide ideation and attempts compared to other adolescent groups. It has been suggested that these data may be explained by family stress and conflict due to intergenerational differences in traditional values. To examine this, in a sample of Mexican female adolescents, my research team and I are exploring the influence of marianismo (traditional gender role expectations for Latina individuals) on family conflict and, in turn, suicide behavior. As an additional (and perhaps alternative) explanatory factor, we are also looking at the influence of emotion regulation on suicide.

Influence of Parental Ethnicity, Control, and Accommodation on Anxiety in Children:

This project is in collaboration with Laura Seligman, Ph.D., UTRGV and Wendy Silverman, Ph.D., Yale University. In clinical and community-based samples, we are examining whether Mexican-American parents (compared to non-Mexican-American parents) report a more controlling parenting style and whether this, in turn, is associated with greater parental accommodation of child anxiety and greater child anxiety.

Using Promotoras and Telemental Health for Offsetting Mental Health Disparities in Rural Areas:

Because traditional mental health care is often sparse or non-existent in rural areas, we are developing a promotora-based intervention program and telemental health services that will provide focused mental health interventions to rural and traditionally underserved groups in south Texas.

Obesity and Suicide Behavior

Although epidemiological studies have found that obesity is associated with suicide behavior, scant research has examined variables that explain this relationship. This project thus examines possible mediators in the relationship between obesity and suicide behavior in individuals in south Texas, a region which has one of the highest rates of obesity in the United States.

Stigma and Mental Health Help-Seeking Behavior

This project is in collaboration with Ana Bridges, Ph.D., University of Arkansas, and examines perceived need, internal barriers, and external barriers to predict mental health service utilization perceptions.

Using Machine Learning Techniques to Assess Suicide Behavior in Latino/a Individuals

This project is utilizing machine learning to precisely assess the relative influences of traditional risk factors and culturally-based factors on suicide behaviors in Latino/a adults.

Psychological Reactions to the COVID-19 Pandemic in Essential Workers in the United States

This project, in collaboration with several colleagues at UTRGV, is longitudinally assessing the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on the mental health of frontline essential workers in the United States. Individuals we are tracking include individuals working in health care, retail services, delivery services, and first responders.
